



# THE POET'S DREAM LAND


"In twilight's hush, where dreams arise, When Star adorn the darkened Skies, Let me weave a tapestry of words, A Poet gift where beauty stirs.

Upon the canvas of the mind, A Symphony of thoughts unwind, Each lines a brushstroke, Soft and bold, To tell a tale yet untold.



But don't fear, you will surely find someone... who will discern your true love... In the eyes of God everyone is unique and precious...





# **PCOD - Polycystic Ovarian Disease PCOS - Polycystic Ovarian Syndrome**



PCOD or PCOS occurs due to or because of high insulin levels because of over consumption of carbohydrates, sugars insulin levels elevates. Over consumption of....

- 1) Full refined carbohydrates
- 2) High sugar content
- 3) High fruit juices

Main reason of this disease is carbohydrates converts to glucose. PCOS are called diabetes of ovaries

Acne, unwanted facial hair(Hirstusim), male pattern baldness, menstrual irregularities, infertility, weight gain is the symptoms of this disease.

Before ovulation estrogen level increase which is created from testosterone hormone? If insulin level is elevated then testosterone doesnot convert to estrogen, ovaries doesnot ovulate. Eggs remain and convert to cyst.

Sex hormone binding globulin (SHBG) binds testosterone then only testosterone levels are maintained. If SHBG is not released properly then testosterone does not bind SHBG and then testosterone is in free condition then only facial hair occurs and to irregular periods.

#### How to reverse PCOD, PCOS?

- Reduce the intake of carbohydrates
- Don't exercise too much (stress)
- Be careful of smoking (frequent high insulin levels)
- Intermediate fasting helps
- Increase the intake of protein and fat rich food

In 2005 researchers followed 11 women with PCOS as they went on a keto diet for six months. The 5 women who completed the study lost weight and improved their hormonal status

In 2013 - keto diet - PCOS reverse

In 2017 - the effect of low carbohydrate diet on PCOS. A meta-analysis of randomized controlled trails.

In 2020 - study conducted on 20 women

# SPACE MEDICINE AND HEALTHCARE ON EARTH



## Space Medicine:

Space Medicine is a specialized field under aerospace medicine that focuses on the medical care of astronauts and space flight participant. In a way helping for development of Healthcare on Earth.

Astronauts are not the only one's who benefit from space medicine research. Several Medicinal products have been developed that are space spinoffs, which are practical applications for the fields of medicine arising out of the space program.

## Background:

Space medicine is important for future orbital and interplanetary returned space flights and also contributes to the development of Earth medicine.

## Remote sensing:

Remote sensing involves collecting, information from a distance via a sensor placed on a satellite or aircraft. Such sensors detect Electromagnetic Radiation (EMR) reflected from the earth up to the sensor. One of the main uses of remote sensing is determining the association between infectious diseases and environmental parameters.

For example, the associations between malaria cases and rainfall, vegetation and temperature have been investigated using remotely sensed data. Other diseases have also been studied, including dengue fever, cholera, meningitis and brucellosis. In the context of the COVID-19 pandemic, remote sensing has been used to detect the distinct areas and indicate successful lock down.

# Global Navigation Satellite System:

A global Navigation satellite system (GNSS) comprises a group of satellites that allows individuals to locate their positions on or near the earth. Once the signal is received from GNSS, another system is required to display the data on a map. This system is referred to as geographic Information system (GIS).

GNSS has been used to research various topics, including epidemiology, non-communicable diseases, physical activity of certain groups, and other topics that have contributed to the development of earth medicine GNSS has also been used in tracking communicable diseases, especially person-to-person, vector-borne and zoonotic diseases. Eg: Corona.

#### Satellite Communication:

Satellite communication refers to the ability of a satellite to transfer information from one area to another. Tele medicine is a valuable application of this space technology, necessary for various situations, including remote areas or difficult-to-reach areas, and time sensitive interventions.

The Satellite For Epidemiology (SAFE) System was developed based on satellite communication to deliver early health warnings. Particularly relevant throughout the Covid-19 global pandemic, emergencies require rapid responses like natural disasters man made emergencies, epidemics and highly infectious diseases.



# Tissue chips substitute human subjects:

Tissue chips are devices that can help scientists perform experiments on living cells that resemble human tissues and organs. The use of tissue chips helps scientific experiments by reducing the need for animal subjects that precede clinical human trails.

An example is the cardinal heart investigation, which used engineered heart tissues, to observe the effect of space on the heart, leading to development in medicine to prevent some cardiac diseases on Earth.

## New postpartum haemorrhage interventions:

Postpartum haemorrhage (PPH) is a medical maternal condition considered the leading cause of death and morbidity after child birth The G-suits, which were designed for astronauts to applyPressure to their bodies in zero gravity space, were modified and implemented to treat postpartumhaemorrhage in females and was successful to stop the bleeding just in 10 hours. Which other wise would extend to more than few weeks.

## Remote monitoring of health conditions:

Early space flights only lasted for short periods. Physiological changes during space travel were monitored but not transmitted back to Earth in real time. Thus, new technologies were needed and developed for ensuring safety and wellness through- out longer trips.

To this end, engineers developed a new technology that monitors physiological changes, time and transmits them to earth. This method is called telemetric health monitoring This technology was later incorporated into intensive care unit (ICU) This technology is now being adopted in next- generation smart phones & fitness trackers, thus allowing doctors to track their patients vitals and other parameters of medicine, while they are outside hospital.

## Research and Development:

Physiological changes incurred in the space micro gravity environment offer sights into earth based pathologies. It helps terrestrials in many ways, whether by providing novel methods of treatment and rehabilitation for vulnerable populations, life saving interventions, or portable diagnostics in space. Continued advancements in space medicine will continue to advance health care on earth. Further more, space research and discoveries are beneficial not only to earth medicine but also to many other fields like safety, environment

Etc. In 2015, the United Nations developed a plan to help development of humans, the planet and prosperity known as the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development (2030 SDG's).
